FURTHER INFORMATION

As part of his research activity, I worked mainly on two themes: the history of logic between the Middle Ages and Leibniz and (predominant interest today) digital publishing, digital cultures, and new forms of textuality. In the first field I dealt with the history of modal logic, with the logical reflection in the German second scholasticism, with discussions on non-existent entities in late scholastic and post-medieval logic and with Leibniz logic. In the second field I mainly dealt with electronic books, changes in the forms of reading, e-learning and tools of cultural production on the net.

I am the author or co-author of over one hundred and twenty books and publications, including the successful Laterza series of manuals on the use of the Internet (6 volumes and over 20 reprints from 1996 to 2004), the essay *Il mondo digitale* (with Fabio Ciotti, Laterza 2000, 16 reprints), the essay *La quarta rivoluzione. Sei lezioni sul futuro del libro* (Laterza 2010, 3 reprints), the essay *L'età della frammentazione. Book culture and digital school* (Laterza 2018, second enhanced edition 2020), and a volume on the logical debate in German Protestant scholasticism (*Palaestra Rationis*. Olschki 1996). I am co-author – with Mirella Capozzi – of the chapter dedicated to modern logic in the volume *The Development of Modern Logic* published by Oxford University Press. I am the scientific director of the Mondadori Educational 'Tailor-made Training' course dedicated to the use of digital tools and methodologies in schools, which during the COVID-19 emergency was included among the free digital initiatives sponsored by the Ministry of Education and was attended by over 40,000 teachers.

I am a founding member of the Italian Association for Humanistic Informatics and Digital Culture (AIUCD) and of the cultural association Liber Liber, promoter of the Manutius Project, a free digital library on the net; I am a member of the Forum del Libro Association, the Italian Society of Logic and Philosophy of Sciences, the Italian Society of Philosophy, the Italian Society of Analytical Philosophy, the Italian Society of e-Learning, the Italian Society of Bibliographic and Library Sciences, the Collaborative Knowledge Building Group (CKBG). I am a member of the Scientific Committee of the journals 'Bollettino dell'Associazione Italiana Biblioteche', 'Biblioteche Oggi Trends', 'Bibliothecae', 'Digitalia', 'Culture Digitali', 'Mediascapes', 'Quaderni DigiLab', 'Quaderni Debate', 'AIDA Informazioni', 'AIB Studi', 'DigitCult', 'New Annals of the Special School for Archivists and Librarians', 'magazén - International Journal for Digital and Public Humanities'.
