CV SUMMARY

Researcher in **Roman archaeology**, **PhD in Humanities** from Universidad Carlos III de Madrid since 2023. My work was awarded the **Summa Cum Laude** distinction and received the **Outstanding Thesis Award** (Premio Extraordinario de Doctorado) by Universidad Carlos III de Madrid.

I hold a **Licentiate degree in History** from Universidad Complutense de Madrid, with a specialisation in Prehistory, and a **Master's in Geographic Information Technologies** from the same university, specialising in its application in Archaeology.

I have completed **three international research stays**: in Italy (Spanish School of History and Archaeology in Rome "EEHAR – CSIC"); in the United Kingdom (Durham University) and Denmark (Aarhus University). I have also been involved in several **national and international research projects**.

My doctoral research has sought to characterise the **household economies of the peasant settlements in Roman Carpetania**. For this, I have specialised in the use of new methods such as **network science** (Social and Spatial Network Analysis) and **Geographic Information Systems**, which have proven to be versatile and very useful tools for archaeological research. With them, I have been able to reveal spatial relationships among household economies and have sought to understand the functioning of the economies of rural areas in the Roman world.

My research endeavours have led to different **high-ranked publications**. Notably, I have authored and co-authored papers in **national and international journals**, like the Journal of Computer Applications in Archaeology and, the Journal of Archaeological Science: Reports, among others. I have also actively participated in **numerous international conferences** and workshops, presenting my findings and methods to the global academic community.

I have accumulated over **200 hours of teaching experience** in subjects related to Classical and Roman culture. I actively participated in the council of the Humanities department, and I am participating in several associations like European Association of Archaeologists, CAA, and Instituto de Cultura y Tecnología at UC3M.
